The 2018 & 2019 AToSS data showed that student voice and agency was an area for improvement. The 2019 School Review also highlighted this as an area to focus on during the course of the 2019 to 2023 School Strategic Plan.

The school's self-evaluation against the FISO Continua of Practice for 'Empowering Students and Building School Pride' was rated as: Evolving Moving Towards Embedding. Individual areas of Student Voice, Student Agency and Student Leadership were rated at: Evolving, Embedding & Embedding respectively.

Next year (2020) will be first year in our next four-year SSP. It has been agreed at Leadership level that this is an area which we need to address from the outset of the review cycle.

As part of the review, anecdotally there were varied understandings of what constitutes voice, agency and leadership. Understandably it was decided that this also needs to be addressed next year.
